

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Apply as early as possible to your college or university to be eligible for their scholarships

- The school you choose to attend is your best source for scholarships
- Keep your grades up, take the ACT and/or the SAT, be involved in leadership activities, community service, volunteering

File your FAFSA as soon after October 1 of your senior year as possible

- Colleges and universities use FAFSA information to determine financial awards
- US Department of Education scholarship search at www.studentaid.gov/scholarships

The BAHS College and Career Center will post Local Scholarships in February. These are scholarships offered by local businesses and citizens just for our graduating seniors.

Ask your employer or your parent's employer about scholarship opportunities

Ask about church sponsored scholarships with your church

If you are a member of a Native American Tribe, contact your tribe for scholarship information

Are you or your parents members of a civic or professional organization? See if they offer scholarships!
